### **Practice Overview**

- Several post-inquest civil claims of considerable value, involving claims for dependency and Human Rights damages.

#### Recent cases

August 2024: Chris successfully represented a doctor who suffered unpleasant injuries after a van reversed into her. After a one-day trial in Hull County Court, the Judge agreed that the van driver had been at fault and awarded the Claimant over £26,000 for her damages and costs.

June 2024: Chris attended Durham and Darlington Coroner's Court to represent an Interested Party in an inquest relating to the death of a recently released prisoner.

May 2024: Chris successfully represented the Ministry of Justice in a high-profile trial concerning an accident in a prison. Chris carefully cross-examined the Claimant's medical expert and critically undermined their evidence. Chris also proved that the Claimant had brought a dishonest claim. April 2024: Chris was instructed to represent a man who had suffered a serious respiratory condition after many years working in a foundry. Chris had been due to represent the Claimant during a two-day limitation trial in Hull County Court. However, after Chris prepared a detailed skeleton argument highlighting the strengths of the Claimant's case, the Defendant settled and agreed to pay costs.
